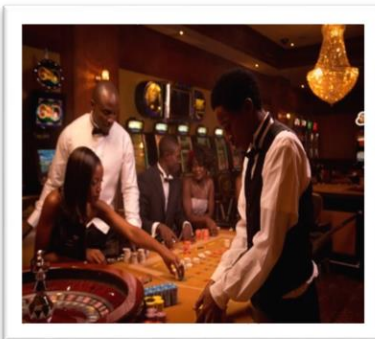
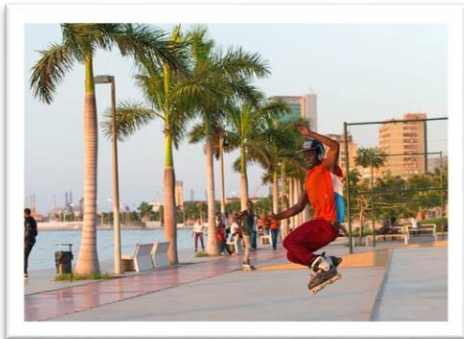

A little background on Mombasa:

Mombasa city is in the coastal region in Kenya, it is one of the oldest cities in East and Central Africa discovered by Arab merchants as early as the 11th century. The city soon became a major trading center in East Africa, mainly for the trade in spices, slaves, coconut and ivory. Commercial connections reached as far as the Indian mainland and China. For centuries it passed from hand to hand – the Arabs, the Portuguese, the Sultanate of Oman, in 1840 it was taken by the Sultan of Zanzibar who later gave it as a gift to the British. It became a protectorate of the British that made Mombasa the maritime terminal of the railway.

Mombasa was the capital of the British colony, until it was decided to transfer her to Nairobi. Mombasa has a sad chapter in the slave trade in Africa, in the 15th century Mombasa was a collection and transit station for slaves brought from various parts of the continent and transported on Arab wooden ships and sold to the highest bidder in the famous slave market in Zanzibar. Until 1963, Mombasa still belonged to Zanzibar, when Zanzibar ceded its ownership to Kenya.

Today, Mombasa is the second largest city in Kenya after Nairobi and boasts a population of about one and a half million people. It is the only city where modernization combines with tradition to give a nice definition of stress-free life hence **“Hakuna Matata!”** meaning **“No Worries”**



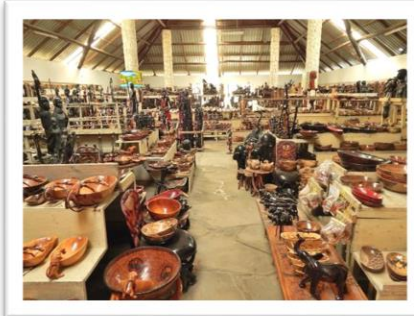
Detailed itinerary for the safari experience in Kenya: (NB:The schedule can change)

Day 1: Flight from Israel to Kenya

Jambo na Karibu Kenya! Welcome to Safari Land!

Upon arrival ,our representative will meet you at the airport and accompanying you to your beach hotel. At the hotel you will expect a warm welcome, a light lunch and assistance to check in. After settling in you will meet our representative at the company counter located in the hotel lobby to be briefed about your vacation and activities you will be doing as well as how to conduct yourself.

Dinner and overnight at Beach Hotel.



Day2: Mombasa City Tour

After breakfast, we will leave the beach hotel at 08:00 in the morning. A short drive to Mombasa city, the guide will accompany you throughout the tour and give explanations about Mombasa in the past and Mombasa today. A very "vibrant" and active day awaits you around the city from Mombasa, in the historical and new parts of the city.

- 1. First visit: (Akamba Village)** We will travel to the western side of Mombasa and visit the artists' village called "**Akamba Village**" after the "Akamba" tribe (which is one of the 42 tribes living in Kenya). The tribe is known for its talent for the art of carving and creating "tam tam" toffees. In the village, we will discover the talents of African art in carving, sculpting, painting, dozens and sometimes hundreds of artists working under make shift wooden sheds. Here there will be an unmediated encounter with the artists and even try your talent at carving with the traditional chisel. After a tour of the first and most important grades, we will visit the main gallery in the village and you will be able to purchase some of the artists' works.

2. **Second visit : (City tour)** From the Artists' Village we head back to the city and take the "Mijikenda" road which takes us to the old train station (no longer in use) but was the main focal point when it came to the transport system at the beginning of the 18th century. From there we will drive to the old "Kalindini" road, which today is called "Moi Avenue" after the second president of Kenya. We will stop by the most famous monument of the city of Mombasa "The giant elephant tusks built in the middle of the avenue. These were created in 1952 to welcome Her Majesty Princess Elizabeth on her first visit to Kenya. Next to the tusks is the "Uhuru Kenyatta" garden, who was the first and mythical president of Kenya and even declared the independence of Kenya .Walk among the huge mango trees with countless fruit bats hanging in clusters on tree branches.
3. **Third visit: (Mombasa Market "MARKITI")** - We will visit Mombasa Market called by the locals "Markiti", the municipal meeting hall for whites only during the colonial period, has now become a beautiful fruit and vegetable market after Kenya's independence. Around the market building, all the streets were turned into shops full of goodies, spices, tools, fabrics, clothes and more... We will walk around and enjoy seeing the agricultural products grown along the coastal area as well as those coming from the highlands of Kenya. Many tropical fruits such as: mangoes, bananas, papaya, along with other crops: tomatoes, potatoes, cashews, coffee and tea.
4. **Fourth visit: (Old City)** We will then proceed to Mombasa's Old City on the "Nkrumah Road" (this street also where the company's main office is).Here you will learn the rich culture and history of the city. A tour of the narrow streets of the Old City, between the old Arab houses and the beautiful wooden balconies. On "Ndia kuu" street you will see the beautiful architecture visible on the doors, windows and balconies of these houses and then you will understand why the place is managed by UNESCO.
Option : To visit the old fortress called "Fort Jesus" ,Today it is a museum confirming a weapons base and displaying architectural works from the 15th century. It was built by the Portuguese to protect their business empire along the east coast of Africa, the use of the name "Jesus" and talk of Portuguese presenting themselves as missionaries served only as camouflage to prevent strong business competition.

Dinner and overnight at Beach Hotel.

It is recommended to take with you on the tour:

- Camera - as there are a lot of souvenir photographs
- Cash for shopping.
- Light but decent clothing, to respect the residents of the Old City who will welcome you.
- Good mood.



"Deep in the wild reserve " Tsavo National Park and Taita Hills Sanctuary

3 days of much more than just a safari

Day 3: (Safari – Day 1) – Tsavo East Reserve

After an early breakfast (6:00 am) leave the hotel and board the safari vehicles. We will cross the city of Mombasa, which is already bustling with life, and drive on Mombasa Nairobi Road. Leaving the city and here you really start to see the views of Kenya. The road passes through the picturesque villages inhabited by the Girama tribe. A glimpse into the economic aspect of the local community. These are mainly small-scale farmers who grow coconut, Cashew nuts, cassava and lots of corn. At this hour, we will see tens of thousands of locals leaving the villages towards the big city to look for work, and especially school children walking many kilometers in order to get to class on time. The road to Tsavo East Reserve is steeped in primeval landscapes with roadside villages. At around 10:00 a.m., you enter the reserve through Buchuma Gate and begin your first tour of the reserve.

As soon as you enter the reserve, we will discover the wonders of the national park, which is part of Tsavo National Park, which is the largest park in Kenya (2081 km) and one of the largest in Africa! Tsavo East is separated from the western part by a railway line linking Mombasa and Nairobi. There is no fence and no separation between the two parks and this allows animals to move freely from one side to the other.

The tour winds its way through vast plains interwoven with forests overlooking fascinating views of the "Taita Hills" and the impressive "Yatta Plateau," which means elephant in the Valiángolo language. A hunter-gatherer community that once inhabited this area. We will meet hippos, one of the most interesting animals in nature. A tour of the rear of the park is a rewarding experience with opportunities to see lions, cheetahs, and large herds of buffalo dangling across the plains.

We will drive to the camp (lodge) for check-in and lunch, get settled. In the afternoon you board the safari vehicles you will enjoy another game drive, here all the beauty of the reserve is revealed with the variety of wild animals: lions, tigers, jackals, deer, impalas, zebras, giraffes, buffalo, and of course do not forget the red elephants. The reserve has the largest herd of red elephants in all of Kenya. For those who love bird watching this is the place to be. The drive along the Galena River offers just the perfect opportunity. Returning to Lodge at sunset.

Dinner and overnight in the Camp/ Lodge on a full board basis.

Day 4: (Safari Day 2) Tsavo National Park to Taita Hills Sanctuary.

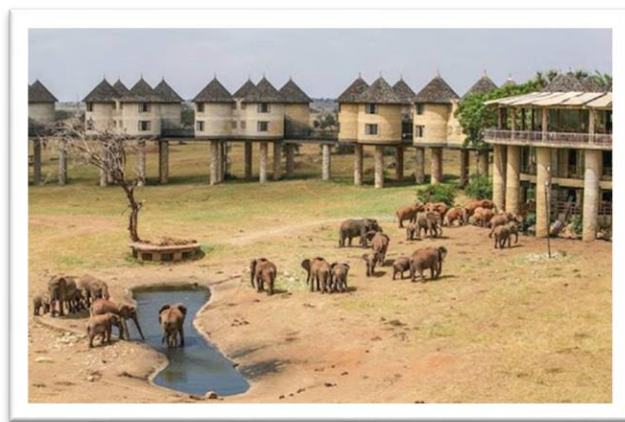
Early morning game drive, hop into the safari vehicles to catch the "morning on safari". The whole safari wakes up to another day of foraging, time to meet with some of the active nocturnal animals in the park who are still "late going to bed." Animals that are rarely seen in the day hyenas, foxes, genets and tigers.

Return to camp/Lodge for the continental breakfast and check out, enroute game drive to exit the reserve heading to Taita Hills Sanctuary. This is actually the highlight of the trip. The reserve is the corridor where the animals pass from the two reserves (Tsavo West and Tsavo East), so in a relatively small place we will see a large concentration of animals. The park is located in Taita-Taveta District, about 220 km from Mombasa and covers an area of 28,000 acres, adjacent to Tsavo West National Park and LUMO Community Wildlife Sanctuary Park. The definition of "animal shelter" was given to the park because part of it is fenced off in order to separate wildlife from local residents. In the past, the animals would come to villages and destroy farmland and locals would be preyed upon by the predatory animals. In response, the locals would organize revenge campaigns and kill the animals. It was a constant "war" between the locals who hunted the animals and the authorities and animal conservation organizations whose goal was to change the situation.

The reserve is actually initiated and privately owned. The reserve has been managed for more than 40 years and has an excellent reputation as one of the region's leading natural areas and its committed approach to wildlife conservation.

The relatively small area of the park ensures that a large number of animals are observed over a small area, so it is easier to identify all the animals here than in the larger Chavo National Park. More than 50 species of large mammals inhabit the reserve. The scenery is dramatic and all the wildlife on the plains is here. The park is home to elephants, lions, antelopes of various kinds, cheetahs, tigers, buffalo, giraffes and more....

Still, most of the reserve is unfenced and therefore the number of wildlife varies throughout the year depending on natural environmental factors. The habitat varies between the types of vegetation and low woodland and the areas of acacia trees in open areas. The reserve has more than 300 species of birds, some of which live in the reserve and some of which the reserve serves as a migration station where troops are gathered for travel between continents. This huge variety makes a tour of Game Drive Reserve." For a unique and unforgettable experience and will provide you with opportunities for an amazing photo encounter, with a refreshing swimming pool amidst an amazing reserve landscape that provides peaceful and pastoral relaxation between tours in the reserve. The refuge is a success story in preserving nature and the wild life that thrives. The tour routes are well supervised to



ensure that animals are not bothered and some areas are completely closed to vehicles. This commitment to responsible ecotourism, so strongly supported by visitors, ensures the conservation of the park and its wildlife to continue to thrive.

Dinner and overnight in the Camp/ Lodge on a full board basis.

Day 5: (safari day 3) Taita Hills Sanctuary to Mombasa

Early morning game drive to try and catch some of the shy nocturnal creatures on the way back to their dens. It's also an opportunity to spot the big cats who are going through hunting lessons for their young kittens.

We will observe two encounters, between a reserve that goes to sleep and a reserve that wakes up to another stormy day of wild landscape and food searches for predators and prey. We return to the lodge for breakfast, prepare to leave and drive back to Mombasa beach town to our beach hotel.(Evening arrival)

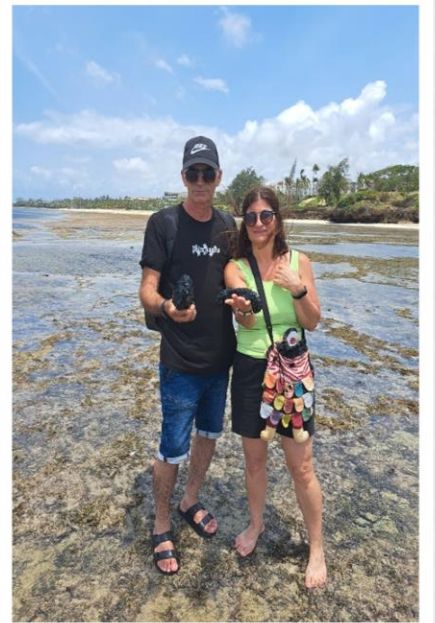
Dinner and overnight at Beach Hotel.

Day 6: Marine Park Sea Safari

After breakfast , depart for Marine Park, sea safari. The marine activity includes snorkeling, glass boats, walking in the water during the tide and meeting the water animals.

For Shabbat observants: A free day at the hotel, you can enjoy the pool on the hotel grounds and the beach. Our team will take you for walks at low tide (sea safaris) and excursions in areas close to the hotel.

Dinner and overnight at Beach Hotel.



Day 7: Funzi Island

Tens of thousands of Israelis defined the cruise to Ponzi Island as an "unforgettable experience"

After an early breakfast we will meet at the hotel reception at 07:00 and drive through Mombasa town towards the southern end of town - to the ferry. Here during rush hour you will meet thousands of friendly shoppers who leave the ferries for work in the city. When you board the ferry, you will see thousands of passengers lining up in perfect order on the sides of the ferry to pass along with you to the other side. The ferry takes a few minutes to cross to the other side and you reach the village of Likoni.

Drive south through the villages inhabited by the Digo tribe and throughout the drive from the side of the road you will notice their economic way of life. The Digo are small-scale farmers who grow an abundance of cashews, coconuts, mangoes, cassava, sugarcane, rice, and even specialize in fishing. We will cross the famous Diani beach which ranks among the ten best beaches in the world. Travel through spectacular landscapes for about half an hour quickly to almost the Tanzanian border. Turn left and reach Bodo Village. Bodo is a village on the shores of FUNZI Bay where your vehicles will park and embark on a cruise on the Dhow ship (which is a traditional Arabic sailing ship) and come for a full day of amazing experience.

Here will be the first morning break since you left the hotel. It's a quick African break of chai (tea) or kahwa {coffee} served with donut – a delicious African pancake.

Armed with a camera, we put our foot forward and we are on board the Dow. Start sailing between the mangrove islands Look and see the king fish or cormorant suddenly diving from the mangroves trees to catch a fish for breakfast, lunch.

After a short cruise, Funzi Island appears in the distance. Relatively it is a large village with a population of about 1200people that includes only 11 families, without televisions!!The descendants of Wakifundi who are the direct descendants of Persian Arabs and today from the Shirazi tribe. Here we will pass through the village and visit the elementary school, the village water well and the local market, and of course the local souvenir shop. Locals will be happy to welcome you and even agree to host you in their homes. Experience how they cook, eat and sleep.

After visiting the village, we will return to the HOW ship and while the captain leads the ship towards the sandbar, we will enjoy the sea view and a cold drink. During a cruise, sometimes you notice pods of dolphins who are just looking to play and chase the dhow boats and thus get the attention of the passengers as well. The sandbar only appears at low tide and here you can swim or snorkel or just go wandering around the island and relax in the hot pools of like a natural jacuzzi. At noon, we will board a sail and sail to Kinazini Island where a sumptuous barbecue lunch awaits you. After lunch, relax on the famous Lamu beds scattered around the restaurant or go for another swim and then drive back to the hotel. Estimated return to the hotel at 18.30.

Dinner and overnight at Beach Hotel

Day 8: "Into the Villages" – a tour into the villages and the experience of life in Kenya.

After breakfast, drive north (about eight kilometers) along the Mombasa-Malindi highway. We will pass through huge and endless groves of "sisal" plants (from which ropes and aloe vera preparations are produced) towards the villages of the Giriama tribe. The Giriama tribe is the largest of the nine tribal groups that make up the Mijikenda community – these are the tribal communities that sit on Kenya's coastal strips. We will visit a local orphan school to interact with the school administration and the children who will be happy for your visit. How much love you will receive from these children who are mostly assisted by locals who volunteer to maintain the school. It is also an opportunity where you can give gifts to children (such as pencils, candy, clothes, books and more...).

From school we will visit the Giriama village, have a walk within the village, meet and stay with the local residents and learn the ethnicity of the community of Giriama.

- You will meet people who are engaged in daily activities within their households and fields.
- Visit the traditional Giriama houses built of mud and wood.
- You will learn and experience part of African culture.
- You will be honored to drink the wine produced from the palm trees and the freshly harvested coconut juice.
- We will learn about the different types of trees and fruits that grow in the coastal areas and taste them.
- And especially enjoyed the feeling of "Genesis" and the beautiful views.

We will leave the village and return to the hotel around 1:00 P.M.



Option B: Free morning option – enjoy a day of health, massages, braiding, tattooing, swimming in the sea, pool activity, shopping in the markets and more.

Haller Park (about 10 minutes' drive from the hotel)

Haller Park is a special place to see Kenya and the vast collection of wildlife. For those staying in Mombasa, the place is highly recommended for a visit. You can stroll through the park and experience the diverse flora and fauna. The naughty monkeys, giant lizards and beautiful scenery. Heller Park is located in the Bamburi Mombasa area and hosts a variety of wildlife including hippos, giraffes, buffaloes, zebras, antelopes, crocodiles and smaller mammals. Species of birds, birds, reptiles and lots of special tropical vegetation. Other animals in the park include porcupines, peacocks, a snake park, a fish farm and also the famous giant tortoises.

The park is full of tropical vegetation, from coconut trees, mangroves and a garden of various types of palm trees and dwarfs. You will be able to see the coastal forest trees with some of the rare and even dangerous plants. The park has play areas, a reptile park, a small demonstration area, a fish farm, a palm garden, a place for feeding crocodiles, as well as a stage for watching and feeding giraffes. The park also offers a variety of attractions at various educational and entertainment points. The place is a paradise for a botanist and a special experience for family, groups and individuals. Highly recommended!

Maasai Market (about 10 minutes drive from the hotel)

Handmade souvenir and art market, cheap and authentic market. Here you will find handicrafts and you can even order bracelets or other works with your name.

The Butterfly House (about 10 minutes' drive from the hotel)

Butterfly House presents a tropical butterfly paradise and an unforgettable experience for visitors. The facility is world-class for ecotourism and invites you to enjoy nature, learn about butterfly biodiversity and its importance to local communities living around the coastal forests.

The park is a spectacular and unique attraction on the Kenya coast, and lies in a quiet space, with a pleasant and cool breeze from the ocean (300 meters from the ocean). A garden maintained to a high and impressive standard. The butterfly house and park where Hore sides is an ideal place for a picnic with the family or just personal peace away from the city noises. It is a happy feeling to be exposed and experience nature and learn about the huge variety of butterflies that contribute to our well-being.

Mamba Village Centre (Crocodile Village)(about 15 minutes' drive from the hotel)

Crocodile Village is populated by hundreds of the world's most feared predators. The village has the largest crocodile farm in East Africa. (The farm was originally established by a group of Israelis and a few years ago was sold to local investors.) The tour of the village begins with an informational video that presents the crocodile, its life cycle and the important ecological role it plays. Visitors to the farm can watch crocodiles from hatching to adulthood. You will also see the 100-year-old "Big Father" crocodile. The big attraction takes place in the afternoon and during feeding. The giant reptiles are pushed towards the feeders to grab a piece of fresh meat which they will tear apart with their prey's teeth. The village also offers horse and camel rides, botanical gardens and a restaurant.

Wild Waters Water World (20 minutes from the hotel)

The water park is the only one of its kind in Kenya and an excellent family recreation center. You can spend half a day or a full day in it. The park provides activities for the whole family, shared slides for family surfing, floating tubing pools, diving pools, relaxation lawns. Over 15 slides for adults and children, and water play stations. Adjacent to the water park there is a playground with aerial and riding carousels for children, bumper cars and many other attractions. The park has a varied food court and an excellent bar.

Other attractions within 10-20 minutes from the hotel.
